



The Oregon Department of Education, along with the American School Counselors Association have developed "Mindsets & Behaviors for Student Success: K-12 Career and College Readiness Standards for Every Student"

- Mindset Standards
 - A set of 6 mindsets that are encouraged for all students
- Behavior Standards
 - Students will demonstrate these standards through classroom lessons, activities and/or individual/small groups. They are broken down into the following 3 categories:
 - Learning Strategies
 - Self-Management Skills
 - Social Skills

- Character Strong & Purposeful People
- PAX Good Behavior Game

Does not require parental consent





Whole

Specialist may support classes with...

- Emotional awareness
- Bullying prevention
- Positive coping strategies
- Mindfulness
- Friendship/community building

Does not require parental consent







Informal Check-ins on a as needed basis

Specialists may check in with students periodically at request of student, staff, or parent

- Student is experiencing short term challenge for example:
 - Changes in social group
 - Changes at home
 - New expectations/ changes to routine
- Student is dysregulated, feeling anxious, or feeling overwhelmed

Does **not** require parental consent







Scheduled Small group instruction

Specialist may work with small groups on

- Includes trillium prevention services
- Group may work on the following:
 - Self-Awareness
 - Self-Management
 - Responsible Decision-Making
 - Relationship Skills
 - Social Awareness

Does require parental consent



Individual scheduled support

Individual students may meet regularly with specialists on specific behavioral or mindset concerns

These concerns will be individualized to each student and will be discussed in a team meeting (that includes parent) prior to initiating individual support.

Does require parent consent







Referral to outside agency

Students who would benefit from more intensive mental health specific needs may be referred to outside support, such as Trillium services

- o Connect students/families with therapists that your insurance will accept
- o In many instances, the on-site Trillium Mental Health Specialist can provide services after going through the referral process
